vera dika explores the reuse of images plots and genres of film history from a broad range of critical perspectives examining works of art and film that resist the pull of the past dika provides an in depth analysis within a variety of media including performance photography punk film and examples from mainstream american and european cinema her study analyzes avant garde art work within the context of contemporary mainstream film practice as well as in relationship to their historical moment

focusing on intermediality the material image situates film within questions of representation familiar from the other arts what is meant by figuring the real how is the real suggested by visual metaphors and what is its relation to illusion how is the spectator figured as entering the text and how does the image enter our world the film's spectator is integral to these concerns cognitive and phenomenological approaches to perception alike claim that spectatorial affect is real even when it is film that produces it central to the staging of intermediality in film tableaux moments in film also figure prominently in the book films by scorsese greenaway wenders and kubrick are seen to address painterly photographic and digital images in relation to effects of the real hitchcock's films are examined with regard to modernist and realist effects in painting chapters on fassbinder and haneke analyze the significance of tableau for the body in pain while a final chapter on horror film explores the literalism of psychopathic tableau here too art and the body images and the real are juxtaposed and entwined in a set of relations

been a legendary figure in the film and television industry for more than 40 years having worked on over 80 feature films including two james bond pictures on her majesty s secret service and the living daylights aliens batman 2001 a space odyssey labyrinth and the rocky horror picture show he reveals in the art of film the stories behind the making of these iconic productions featuring behind the scenes photographs and terry s own production sketches many of which are published here for the first time the art of film is an essential read for all lovers of classic cinema

received an honorable mention for the 2017 british association of film television and screen studies baftss best monograph award from shortbus to shame and from oldboy to irreversible film festival premieres regularly make international headlines for their shockingly graphic depictions of sex and violence film critics and scholars alike often regard these movies as the work of visionary auteurs hailing directors like michael haneke and lars von trier as heirs to a tradition of transgressive art in this provocative new book mattias frey offers a very different perspective on these films exposing how they are also calculated products designed to achieve global notoriety in a competitive marketplace paying close attention to the discourses employed by film critics distributors and filmmakers themselves extreme cinema examines the various tightropes that must be walked when selling transgressive art films to discerning audiences distinguishing them from generic horror pornography and hollywood product while simultaneously hyping their salacious content deftly tracing the links between the local and the global frey also shows how the directors and distributors of extreme art house fare from both europe and east asia have significant incentives to exaggerate the exotic elements that would differentiate them from angle american product extreme cinema also includes original interviews with the programmers of several leading international film festivals and with niche distributors and exhibitors giving readers a revealing look at how these institutions enjoy a symbiotic relationship with the taboo breakers of art house cinema frey also demonstrates how these apparently transgressive films actually operate within a strict set of codes and conventions carefully calibrated to perpetuate a media industry that fuels itself on provocation

a cinema of poetry brings italian film studies into dialogue with fields outside its usual purview by showing how films can contribute to our understanding of aesthetic questions that stretch back to homer joseph luzzi considers the relation between film and literature especially the cinematic adaptation of literary sources and more generally the

fields of rhetoric media studies and modern italian culture the book balances theoretical inquiry with close readings of films by the masters of italian cinema roberto rossellini vittorio de sica luchino visconti michelangelo antonioni federico fellini pier paolo pasolini bernardo bertolucci and others luzzi s study is the first to show how italian filmmakers address such crucial aesthetic issues as the nature of the chorus the relation between symbol and allegory the literary prehistory of montage and the place of poetry in cinematic expression what pasolini called the cinema of poetry while luzzi establishes how certain qualities of film its link with technological processes capacity for mass distribution synthetic virtues and vices as the so called total art have reshaped centuries long debates a cinema of poetry also explores what is specific to the italian art film and more broadly italian cinematic history in other words what makes this version of the art film recognizably italian a thought provoking and well written investigation of the role of history and realism in italian cinema and the role played by the centuries long tradition of poetry or more precisely poesis in this quest h italy ambitious inventive learned a cinema of poetry brilliantly analyzes the art in the art film by showing how italian cinema uses a chorus or expresses itself through allegory this impressively intelligent re description of the tradition surely takes its place alongside other necessary histories of italian cinema choice joseph luzzi is a professor of comparative literature at bard college he is the author of romantic europe and the ghost of italy which received the mla s scaglione prize for italian studies my two italies a new york times book review editors choice and in a dark wood what dante taught me about grief healing and the mysteries of love

david bordwell and kristin thompson are two of america's preeminent film scholars you would be hard pressed to find a serious student of the cinema who hasn't spent at least a few hours huddled with their seminal introduction to the field film art now in its ninth edition or a cable television junkie unaware that the independent film channel sagely christened them the critics of the naughts since launching their blog observations on film art in 2006 the two have added web virtuosos to their growing list of accolades pitching unconventional long form pieces engaged with film artistry that have helped to redefine cinematic storytelling for a new age and audience minding movies presents a selection from over three hundred essays on genre movies art films animation and the business of hollywood that have graced bordwell and thompson s blog informal pieces conversational in tone but grounded in three decades of authoritative research the essays gathered here range from in depth analyses of individual films such as slumdog millionaire and inglourious basterds to adjustments of hollywood media claims and forays into cinematic humor for bordwell and thompson the most fruitful place to begin is how movies are made how they work and how they work on

between the 1890s and the 1930s movie going became an established feature of everyday life across america movies constituted an enormous visual data bank and changed the way artist and public alike interpreted images this book explores modern painting as a response to and an appropriation of the aesthetic possibilities pried open by cinema from its invention until the outbreak of world war ii when both the art world and the film industry changed substantially artists were watching movies filmmakers studied fine arts the membrane between media was porous allowing for fluid exchange each chapter focuses on a suite of films and paintings broken down into facets and then reassembled to elucidate the distinctive art film nexus at successive historic moments

in a market long dominated by hollywood french films are consistently the most widely distributed non english language works french cinema however appears to undergo a transformation as it reaches britain becoming something quite different to that experienced by audiences at home drawing on extensive archival research the authors examine in detail the discourses debates and decisions which have determined the place accorded to french cinema in british film culture in so doing they provide a fascinating account of this particular instance of transnational cinematic traffic while simultaneously shedding new light on british film history from the early days of the film society via the advent of the x certificate to the new possibilities of video and dvd this book reveals the complex and detailed history of the distribution exhibition marketing and reception of french cinema in britain

kilbourn provides a comparative theorization of the representation of memory in both mainstream and international cinema within an increasingly transnational context of production and reception he sees cinema as providing the viewer with not only the content and form of memory but also the art of memory

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
